DR. TIFFANY SPICER NAMED WISD SUPERINTENDENT

On October 4, Waco ISD named Dr. Tiffany Spicer as the next superintendent. Coming with 20 years of experience in Texas education, Spicer hails from Buna ISD where she served as superintendent from 2022 to 2024. Spicer will be the second African American and the first African American woman to lead the district. "I am deeply committed to working together with all members of our community to build a brighter future for our students, staff, and schools," she declared.

Spicer has not come with a "cookie cutter" plan for the district, she said. Instead, asserting that "to lead effectively, I believe it's essential to first listen and learn," she intends to engage with the district and the community from various vantage points to discover what is going well and what is not. Only then after she has gotten the full picture, she says, can she develop a plan for the district.

Spicer has already posted her "Community Engagement Plan for Waco ISD." There she indicates that during her first 90 days she will conduct a comprehensive "Listening and Learning Tour" across Waco ISD engaging students, parents, teachers, staff, and community leaders to understand their experiences and

insights." Listening sessions will be set up. There will be focus groups at every campus during which she will ask questions to learn what is happening on campuses. She will be speaking with teacher and paraprofessional groups, student groups, and parent groups. Also, she will engage with business partners and community groups.

Spicer acknowledges that there are areas that must be handled immediately such as attendance, boundaries, and upcoming construction. While dealing with right-now issues is paramount, she argues that taking the time to engage with the stakeholders will allow her to develop a vision and plan for the district for which the community can hold her account-

able. That said, she does have goals for the district already which include the following: establish a strong foundation, amplify its message, build strong partnerships, champion equity and inclusion, ensure transparency and accountability, and celebrate achievements and foster pride. "community" repeatedly during the hiring process, Spicer says she wants to "get the pulse of the community" and "hear people's voices." Toward that end, the Waco NAACP and the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc. will host a community reception for Spicer on Thursday, December 19 from 5:30PM-7:30PM at the Waco Multi-Purpose Building. Spicer will discuss her plans for the district and will answer commu-

nity members' questions. All are invited to attend.

Spicer attended the University of Texas at Austin where she obtained her Bachelor of Social Work, Texas State University-San Marcos for her Masters in Educational Leadership, and Texas A&M University for her Doctorate of Philosophy. She is the proud mother of two adult daughters.

A BAHÁ'Í TALKS ABOUT JESUS

During the Christmas season, naturally I think about Jesus, even though I'm a Bahá'í. After all, Bahá'ís love and revere Jesus Christ: "Through the Love of God, Christ was sent into the world with His inspiring example of a perfect life of self-sacrifice and devotion, bringing to men the message of Eternal Life." – 'Abdu'l-Bahá, Paris Talks

Just after I became a Bahá'í years ago, I ran into a work buddy with three of his friends, and when they asked what was new, I told them.

I told them about the prophet and founder of the Bahá'í Faith, Bahá'u'lláh. As expected, they pressed me about what we believe about Jesus: "Do Bahá'ís also believe that He died for our sins?" This led to a discussion of atonement, of all things, including some of my own understanding of the competing theories of the atonement in Christianity, past and present.

For many Christians, atonement makes individual reconciliation with God possible. Many Christians view Jesus' profound suffering on the cross as a cosmic and climactic event, by which His death

and resurrection brought about redemption and salvation from sin.

Bahá'u'lláh, in the following passage, not only glorifies Jesus, but offers a new vision the Christ's atonement that I believe solves many traditional issues with the Christian doctrine:

"Know thou that when the Son of Man [Christ] yielded up His breath to God, the whole creation wept with a great weeping. By sacrificing Himself, however, a fresh capacity was infused into all created things. Its evidences, as witnessed in all the peoples of the earth, are now manifest


before thee...

"We testify that when He came into the world, He shed the splendor of His glory upon all created things. Through Him the leper recovered from the leprosy of perversity and ignorance. Through Him, the unchaste and wayward were healed. Through His power, born of Almighty God, the eyes of the blind were opened, and the soul of the sinner sanctified." – Gleanings from the Writings of Bahá'u'lláh

In other words, Christ's death upon the cross was a sacrifice, but not one of penal substitution by way of "paying God back" for the debt of our sins.

From a Bahá'í perspective, Christ's sacrifice released a great transformative force and energy into the world. God sent all the world's great Prophets into the world with one aim, to sow in the hearts of men love, goodwill and unity, and for this great Cause they were willing to suffer and to die. The Cause of Bahá'u'lláh is the same as the Cause of Christ.

G. V. Clark, who founded the program, operates under the MBGCT Foreign Mission Board, chaired by Reverend Ivie Rich. The initiative serves Belize, an Englishspeaking Central American nation that gained independence from Britain in 1981.

The mission consists of fifty-one missionaries from Texas with five delegates from Louisiana, whose objective is to teach God's word, share God's love and feed God's people. It was

accomplished in cooperation with Belizean ministers, Rev-

es, they see the needs coupled with the warmth of the Working Belizean people. through local churches, the mission team established stations in key areas to distribute essential items, including shoes, clothing, toiletries, and food. The group plans to provide more than 1,000 backpacks filled with school supplies to local students. Several Waco churches joined in this initiative.

Many from the Belizean communities spend hours standing in line at the various stations to receive the blessings being brought to them each morning by convention workers. They wait patiently to receive a food box which will last more than a month, as well as other needed items. Later, the missionaries (convention workers) will be divided into prayer cells for home visitations to include intercessory prayer, spiritual counseling, and encouragement through Scripture and presenting homes with special gifts.

At the heart of this mission trip is sharing the good news of God's word, and the love of Jesus, Great preparation goes into lesson plans, visual aids and class activities, not only for preschoolers and other children, but to engage each adult in the lessons.

The nightly revival has experienced standing-roomonly by participants on previous visits, as worship services are filled with the power of the Holy Spirit. Churches and other entities graciously provide special transportation to guarantee that persons desirous of attending these spirit filled services must travel from all across Belize.

"This mission affords us a wonderful opportunity to serve the proud and hospitable people of Belize," said Dr. Davis who instructs local clergy. Dr Worthey served as instructor for one of the women's groups. She noted that while the mission's aim is to serve others, participants often find themselves deeply touched by the experience. "As much as we try to give of ourselves, we ultimately receive far more than we give," she said.

valuables, like my car keys and what little money I had. I had learned a lot in my 29 years. With lightning speed, I dashed out the backdoor, tripping over the threshold, but still holding my balance and determination. Thank God my boy was spending the night with a friend. It was pitch-black dark outside, as I had no time to flip on the outside lights. I just needed to get out. Once inside my car, I let out a sigh, unaware that I had been holding my breath. Quickly locking the car doors, I knew I was on my way. The car was run down and bent up, but it was my path to freedom tonight and my only means of transportation. I'll never forget it. It was a gray and black Toyota, well....a fading gray and a fading black, a hatchback, about 8 years old at the time, and a stick. Ha! A stick. That could be a holdup since I was still in the learning stage, but I could handle it. I tried to crank the old trap, but it just clicked. I tried again, combining my efforts with a plea. "Please God, I need my car!" Just as the motor turned over, I heard that dreadful sound, a swatch-type sound, like an old screen door dragging. My God! He knew I was going to try to get away. He

knew, so he had unlocked the hatch back, ahead of time! He was in the back so fast; all I could do was bite my lip and jerk forward. "Stop the car, Lynn, and give me the money!" he yelled, as he swiftly crawled into the back seat. He lurched through the bucket seats so fast that my head literally seemed to spin, like the girl in the Exorcist. Grabbing the steering wheel, he yelled again, "Gimme the money, Lynn!" The Exorcist...I was sure that his voice changed. But tonight...no, not tonight. I kept driving, the car swerving across into the other the lane and back again as he, too, gripped the wheel. We came within inches of hitting a minivan. I saw head lights

of an 18 wheeler that we also barely missed as we sped into the on-coming traffic. Hands pinned to the wheel, I was driving to my pastor's house, and no one was stopping me. That was the life I lived for most of my 16 years of marriage to a crack addict, one that was much different from my single days of the quiet, country, church girl. I had never touched drugs in my life. I smoked only one cigarette that nearly killed me. And here I was, 29 years old, married to a drug addict. I had so many similar stories to contend with, jumping fences to get my car back from the drug dealers, standing toe- totoe and nose-to-nose with dealers who threatened to kill me if I didn't leave them alone about getting my car back, knocks on the door in the middle of the night from thugs demanding money my husband owed them, stealing my own car back and driving backwards, trying to miss the flying bullets. You name it; I just about dealt with it. Many times over the years, I walked into my house to find that every piece of furniture and every appliance was gonesold in exchange for drugs. I remember waking up one Christmas Day to find that

my babies' gifts were gone, sold for drugs. Once, I frantically searched the streets of Tampa because my husband put our 6-year-old out of the car since it was "too dangerous to take him to the crack house," he said. This was before the days of cell phones. I don't even remember how I found my baby boy. I could go on and on, but the only thing that matters is that one day, I accepted the truth that I had to forgive if I expected to move on with my life. I have since come to grips with the truth, that my now ex-husband was a good person, who loved people. When he was straight, he would give away his last. When he was not, he would take another person's last. I literally saw him take his shirt off and give it away. Once he pulled off his watch and gave it away, and then took my watch and gave it away, too. He had a heart of gold, but in addiction, he was the devil. Still, I had to find a way to forgive.
